- · Review your correspondence thoroughly
- View the code for clarification, the link is in your letter
- You have a right to an advisor, the link to request is in your letter

Accused or Reporting Individual

- Reporting individuals bring forth violations
- Accused students are charged with violations

Witnesses

- Names of witnesses have to be given in advance of hearings
- Witnesses must appear in person to give statements

Before The Hearing

- Review the notification, ensure understanding, contact SCCS with questions
- Set a reminder and be on time for your hearing
- Prepare any relevant evidence, present at the hearing
- Prepare questions to ask at the hearing
- Prepare opening, introductory, or impact statements (if applicable)





Conduct Board or Administrative 1-1

- You are able to give an account of the incident

 There is a time of the incident.
- There is a time for questions and follow-up
 Proponderance of Evidence Standard (More
- Preponderance of Evidence Standard(More Likely Than Not...) - is used to determine responsibility
- Correspondence is sent directly to your Buffalo State email account

Post Hearing

- A decision will be sent via email
 Appeals are accepted within 3 c
